
## San Antonio Greenways and Cycling Network

- 4. Greenway colors shown here for each trail seek to balance the City of San Antonio's chosen colors in their Greenway Design Guide with accessibility and legibility.
- 5. Major Parks feature large parking lots and various other facilities including restrooms, water fountains, splash pads, playgrounds, ball fields, and dog parks, among others.
- 6. Parks feature parking lots and usually have other facilities including restrooms, water fountains, and playground equipment, among others.
- 7. Trailheads have small parking lots and may feature porta potties, bike repair stations, and water fountains.
- 8. Neighborhood Connections are publicly accessible links from roads to greenways with limited facilities such as wayfinding signs. Most do not have parking or water fountains.
- 9. Bike lanes shown here are only those that either directly adjoin a greenway or safe-cycling facility, or are proximate enough to be a key component of an on street connection 10. Future Trails include those funded by the 2022 City of San Antonio Bond, Bexar County/SARA's River and Creeks Program, and trails seeking granted funding sources.
